# “Reflecting Back, Looking Forward”

## Conference Overview

The Indian Law Section of the FBA is pleased to present the 35th Annual Federal Bar Association Indian Law Conference, held in Indian Country for only the second year at the Pueblo of Pojoaque's Buffalo Thunder Resort. This anniversary conference provides an opportunity to acknowledge and learn from the advocates who have worked on behalf of Native peoples for decades, while thoughtfully reflecting on the critical role of history in federal Indian law. At the same time, this event takes a deliberate look forward to identify and engage the complex issues that will affect tribes for years to come.

Several plenary sessions will address the contemporary status of governmental functions in Indian Country, including Indian health services,

criminal justice, and the enforcement of tribal protective orders. Specialized panels will contemplate the constitutional status of tribes, tribal sovereign immunity in the commercial law context, re-engaging the executive branch, and confidentiality in tribal representation. Focus group sessions will allow smaller audiences to discuss topics including legal services in Indian Country, tribal language and the law, cultural resources protection, and the federal/tribal dialogue.

With a respected group of speakers including recent federal appointees, academic scholars, and our community's visionaries, the 35th Annual Federal Bar Association Indian Law Conference stands to be one of the most remarkable yet.

## Enrollment and Fees

Enrollment in the conference is open to all persons with an interest in Native American legal issues. The deadline for registration by mail or fax is March 26, 2010. The conference fee includes one ticket to each luncheon and one ticket to the Thursday night reception as well as one set of course materials as provided by the speakers.
