Re: Cease and Desist Aiding and Abetting the Ayala Faction at the Chukchansi Gold Resort and Casino

To Whom It May Concern:

This written notice is being delivered to Bally Gaming (in such capacity, the "VENDOR") to inform you of the legal implications under applicable Tribal and federal law of your current position to recognize, coordinate and conspire with the Ayala Faction.¹³ This letter also hereby demands that you cease and desist from further facilitation, coordination, and conspiring actions with the Ayala Faction. As you may or may not know, on February 21, 2013, Nancy Ayala attempted to overthrow the Picayune Indian Rancheria by disenrolling 860 Tribal Members, remove the entire Tribal Council (except for herself), and take over the Tribal Administration Buildings and Casino with her security force. Only after her plan failed did she reach out to formerly suspended Tribal Council Members to broker deals with them in an effort to put together a patch-work Tribal Council and hold itself out as the governing body of the Tribe.

The Casino's depository bank, however, recognized this sham and did not provide the Ayala Faction access to the Casino's bank accounts. This is the very reason that the Ayala Faction now pays with Casino cage cash and not bona fide checks from the bank. To make matters worse, the depository banks are now alleging that over \$100,000 of fraud and theft has occurred at the Casino cage through these cash transactions. (See attached e-mail from Rabobank as Exhibit 1). **We understand that you continue to work with the Ayala Faction and that you are currently attempting to be paid by the Ayala Faction. Please cease and desist from these activities or risk becoming implicated in the criminal activities through an aiding and abetting legal theory.**

To be clear, the Picayune Rancheria of Chukchansi Indians ("Tribe") fully intends to seek resolution of its pending governance issues either through a State or Federal Court, or through the Interior Board of Indian Appeals as well as the Department of Interior in the issuance of a final agency action recognizing the legitimate Tribal Council, as the legal governing body of the Tribe. The Tribe is highly confident that the governance issues will be decided in its favor, consistent with well-established Tribal and federal law. When this inevitably occurs and a favorable final agency action is issued, such decision will not only recognize the legitimacy of the Tribal Council, but will also recognize all Tribal Court Orders issued under the Tribal Council's authority to be legitimate, thereby allowing for appropriate enforcement of any such orders in Federal Court. Consequently, we recommend that you do not take this notice and demand lightly.

As if the above information is not enough for VENDOR to discontinue working with the Ayala Faction, then please review the profound statement made by the General Council of the Tribe regarding the Tribe's self-governance and leadership via a recent referendum coordinated by Indian Dispute Resolution Services ("IDRS"). This referendum is entitled **REFERENDUM OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL TO AFFIRM BY RESOLUTION THE COMPOSITION OF THE TRIBES' CURRENT GOVERNING BODY AND THE RECENT EFFORTS TO RESTORE AN EFFECTIVE TRIBAL GOVERNMENT** ("Referendum"). A true and correct copy of an unsigned petition containing this Referendum is attached as Exhibit A to the Resolution (defined below) attached hereto as Exhibit 2. Through this Referendum, the General Council of the Tribe has conducted Tribal business pursuant to Article XI - Referendum of the Tribe's Constitution. In summary, it is Rosette, LLP's opinion that this Referendum and the related Resolution (defined below) represent a legitimate and clear expression of the will of the Tribe's membership on several fundamental points regarding the current leadership dispute. As both a practical and legal matter, the direction provided by the Tribe's membership through this Constitutional referendum process creates a significant launch point for restoring order to the Tribe.

Significantly, as of April 18, 2014, IDRS confirmed receipt of 334 petitions signed by qualified voters of the Tribe, far exceeding the 225 qualified voter signatures required for a referendum to be effective.¹⁴ A true and correct copy of the April 18, 2013 letter from IDRS to the Tribal Council confirming receipt of 334 signed petitions is attached as Exhibit B to the Resolution (defined below) attached hereto as Exhibit 2. In summary, General Council Members voted to pass the Referendum, effectively approving:

¹⁴ Pursuant to Article XI of the Tribe's Constitution, "[u]pon presentation to the Tribal Council of a petition signed by 30% of the qualified voters, the Tribal Council shall either: (1) adopt the provisions of the petition by ordinance; resolution; or (2) call an election at which the issue(s) presented by the petition may be voted on within 60 days by secret ballot." There are currently 750 qualified voters in the Tribe. Thus at least 225 qualified voter signatures were required in order to reach the 30% threshold required for a referendum.

1. The forfeiture of all rights as a Tribal Council member by Charles Sargosa for having "absented himself from three successive meetings without being excused for cause";
2. The appointment of Irene Waltz as the next highest vote-receiver in the December 1, 2012 Tribal Council Election, to fill the Mr. Sargosa's forfeited position;
3. The current composition of the Tribal Council as: (i) Reggie Lewis, Acting Chairman (active member); (ii) Chance Alberta, Acting Secretary/Treasurer (active member); (iii) Carl "Buzz" Bushman, Member-at-Large (active member); (iv) Irene Waltz, Member-at-Large (active member); (v) Karen Wynn (suspended member); (vi) Tracey Brechbuehl (suspended member); (vii) Nancy Ayala (suspended member).

On April 18, 2013, the Tribal Council adopted Resolution 2013-63, entitled **ADOPTING THE REFERENDUM OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL TO AFFIRM BY RESOLUTION THE COMPOSITION OF THE TRIBE'S CURRENT GOVERNING BODY AND THE RECENT EFFORTS TO RESORT AN EFFECTIVE TRIBAL GOVERNMENT** ("Resolution").¹⁵ Significantly, the Tribal Council has the authority to conduct Tribal business when a quorum, or four members, of the Tribal Council is present pursuant to Article VI – Meetings, Section 2. *See also* Article IV – Governing Body, Section 2. Such power includes the authority to establish and enforce Tribal laws through resolution adopted by a quorum of the Tribal Council. *See* Article V – Powers of the Governing Body, subparagraphs (a), (b), (c), and (x). Accordingly, adoption of this Resolution by a quorum of the Tribal Council effectively implemented the Referendum in its entirety as Tribal law, pursuant to the democratic vote of all qualified Tribal voters.

The recent action of the General Council definitively demonstrates the will of the Tribal community and is consistent with well-established Tribal and Federal law, as articulated in previous meetings with various agencies and entities including the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA"), the National Indian Gaming Commission ("NIGC"), and the California Gambling Control Commission ("CGCC"). The Tribe's laws expressly provide that the existing members of the Tribal Council shall continue to serve until their successors are properly seated. *See* Constitution, Article VII, Section 1; Election Ordinance, Article X, Section 4; Article IX – Vacancies. Federal policy and precedent is to recognize the last undisputed Tribal governing body during an election dispute, and to deter to tribal self-governance for the resolution of internal tribal disputes and interpretation of tribal law. This Federal policy and precedent is consistent with Tribal law and the General Council's determination.

With this definitive direction from the General Council, the Tribe is eager to move beyond the contentiousness and divisiveness that has damaged the welfare of the Tribal community and jeopardized the stability of Tribal governmental operations. We understand that you have continued to provide services and/or products to Tribal entities during this time of struggle, though you may not have been compensated for the same as of this date. A large part

of the problem lies in the fact that the rogue faction, led by Nancy Ayala, misdirected funds that were supposed to be deposited into very specific bank accounts so that the Tribe and its enterprises could continue financial operations, including issuance of payment to various vendors and service providers such as yourself. Such misdirection even included directives to issue cash payments to vendors. However, rest assured, the Tribe is committed to honoring its commitments and will do so as soon as practically possible.

We also understand that you may have received conflicting direction from the legitimate Tribal Leadership and the rogue faction led by Ayala. However, in light of this Referendum, one thing should be very clear to you: the legitimate Tribal Council is that as defined above and in the attached Referendum. If you have any lingering question about who comprises the legitimate leadership body of the Tribe (i.e., the exclusive authority that you should be taking direction from in connection with any Tribal-related business), contact me immediately. Otherwise, the Tribe will conclude that you understand and accept this directive.

Accordingly, the Tribe requires that you immediately recognize and adhere to the resounding determination of the General Council regarding the legally valid Tribal Council governing body. To do so, you must immediately cease and desist from taking any direction from, having any discussions with, and entertaining any contentions by those individuals and entities that chose to violate Tribal laws (including those individuals and entities that aided and conspired in the violation of Tribal laws) rather than participate in a civil and legal manner in the Tribe's democratic process. This includes any and all such contact with Nancy Ayala, Charles Sargosa, Tracey Brechbuehl, Karen Wynn, Dyann Eckstein, Michael Wynn, Ted Atkins, Giffen Tan, Sheila Olson, Carla Simpson, Tricia Attard, and/or Joyce Markle.

Those entities that choose to disregard the Referendum and the Tribe's laws will be pursued to the fullest extent possible, under all theories possible (e.g., conspiracy, fraud, aiding and abetting), and in all forums possible, including but not limited to the Picayune Rancheria Tribal Gaming Commission (the licensing authority) and the Picayune Rancheria of Chukchansi Indians Tribal Court. Moreover, the Picayune Rancheria Tribal Gaming Commission will report to the appropriate authorities (e.g., CGCC, NIGC, etc.) any all licensing actions taken by it based upon a failure to heed this directive. We greatly appreciate your anticipated decision to respect the Tribe's sovereignty and self-governance. As you can see, the Tribe has proven that it can – and will – resolve its internal issues through its own Tribal laws and dispute resolution process. Your decision to exercise patience and discernment is much appreciated by the Tribe as it works through this process.

Finally, you should note two significant facts that flow directly from this Referendum. First, all actions taken by Nancy Ayala and her supporters are *void ab initio*. This includes, but is not limited to the kangaroo tribal court she established following the events of February 21, 2013, as well as all actions taken therein. This also includes, but is not limited to, the creation of the sham gaming commission and all of its actions. Second, and more significantly, all actions taken by the Tribal Council led by Acting Chairman Reggie Lewis, including but not limited to the actions initiated and taken in the Tribal Court for the Picayune Rancheria of the Chukchansi Indians (created long before the events of February 21, 2013) as well as all actions taken by the

legitimate Picayune Rancheria Tribal Gaming Commission are valid and remain in full force and effect under Tribal and other applicable law.

It has recently come to the bank's attention that Ms. Ayala and Mr. Saragosa may be engaging in activity which might be in violation of California Penal Code section 476a- among other statues. The bank is currently investigating this matter. The activity which is most concerning is the issuance of checks by Mr. Saragosa and Ms. Ayala from the Tribe's United Security Bank ("USB") account (Acct # 9592715114)("Account"). Rabobank understands that the Account was frozen on or about March 7, 2013; and no checks should have been written against the Account, by the Ayala faction, unless they were previously vetted by USB and the Lewis faction.

On March 14, 2013, Mr. Jones, attorney for USB, issued a letter to the attorneys representing both factions (see attached USB Letter to Tribal Council) in his letter, Mr. Jones in no uncertain terms made it clear to both parties that no payments would be honored by USB unless the payments went through the pre-screening process prior to the checks being presented. Nevertheless, members of the Ayala faction, Ms. Ayala and Mr. Saragosa, continued to issue checks from the Account without going through the pre-screening process. It is the bank's understanding that the Casino management is only recognizing the authority of the Ayala faction, and as such- under the direction of the Ayala faction, the attached checks were then cashed at the Casino and then deposited into the Tribe's Rabobank account. This has results in well over \$100,000.00 worth of bad checks being deposited into the Rabobank account- which have been returned by USB as "Refer to Maker" (see attached).

Ms. Ayala and Mr. Saragosa had full knowledge that the Account has been frozen since early March. Nevertheless, they have written checks out of that Account as recently as March 28, 2013- which have been deposited into the Tribe's Rabobank account. Knowingly depositing bad checks into Rabobank for credit, that the customer knew will not be honored by USB, appears on its face to be fraud. Not only are both banks being harmed by this activity, but the Casino is also being defrauded out of thousands of dollars by forcing Casino employees to cash bad checks which the owners know will not be honored.

The bank demands that this activity cease immediately. If this activity continues, the bank will be forced to no longer provide remote deposit capture services to the Casino. The bank wants to work with all parties to ensure the continued operations of the Casino. However, continued activity, such as this, may force the bank to cease providing any services to the Casino pending a resolution of all outstanding Tribal disputes.

RESOLUTION # 2013- 63

ADOPTING THE REFERENDUM OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL TO AFFIRM BY RESOLUTION THE COMPOSITION OF THE TRIBE'S CURRENT GOVERNING BODY AND THE RECENT EFFORTS TO RESTORE AN EFFECTIVE TRIBAL GOVERNMENT

- WHEREAS,** the Picayune Rancheria of Chukchansi Indians (the "Tribe") is a sovereign, federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Constitution of the Tribe which was ratified on October 22, 1988; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council of the Tribe (the "Tribal Council") is authorized pursuant to Article IV, Section 2 of the Tribe's Constitution (the "Constitution") to exercise governmental authority on behalf of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article XI of the Constitution, [u]pon presentation to the Tribal Council of a petition signed by 30% of the qualified voters, the Tribal Council shall either: (1) adopt the provision(s) of the petition by ordinance resolution, or (2) call an election at which the issue(s) presented by the petition may be voted on within 60 days by secret ballot; and,
- WHEREAS,** in light of the political unrest that has existed amongst the Tribe as of February 21, 2013, a referendum was initiated by petition titled "Referendum Of The General Council to Affirm By Resolution The Composition Of The Tribe's Current Governing Body And The Recent Efforts To Restore An Effective Tribal Government" pursuant to Article XI of the Constitution (sample petition attached hereto as Exhibit A); and,
- WHEREAS,** the referendum process was overseen and monitored by the Indian Dispute Resolution Services ("IDRS"), an Indian owned non-profit entity specializing in these matters; and,
- WHEREAS,** since April 2, 2013, IDRS has tabulated the results of the referendum and the number of petitions signed by qualified voters, pursuant to the Constitution; and,
- WHEREAS,** on April 18, 2013, IDRS submitted a letter to the Tribal Council (attached hereto as Exhibit B), informing them that as of the date of the letter, IDRS confirmed receipt of 334 signed petitions by qualified voters of the Tribe, which exceeded the 225 signatures of qualified voters required for a referendum to be effective under Article XI of the Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, having been presented with a valid referendum, meeting the requirements of the Constitution, the Tribal Council finds it is in the best interests of the tribe and its membership to adopt the referendum in its entirety, by resolution, pursuant to the specific mandate contained in Article XI of the Constitution; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council hereby adopts, in its entirety, the "Referendum Of The General Council to Affirm By Resolution The Composition Of The Tribe's Current Governing Body And The Recent Efforts To Restore An Effective Tribal Government;" and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council hereby affirms the removal of Councilman Charles Sargosa for having "absented himself from three successive meetings without being excused for cause," which is a violation under Article X, Section 3 of the Constitution; and


