Dear Tribal Leaders:

I am writing to inform you that, after 22 years with the United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Michigan, I have decided to leave the office. My last day will be December 22. Please know that the decision was not easy to make. I have enjoyed my work tremendously, especially my work with the Tribes in the Western District. The United States Attorney's Office has always supported my work in Indian Country, be it the prosecution of cases or liaison matters. I know this Office will continue to work on a government-to-government basis on Indian Country issues. Indian Country issues will remain a priority in the Western District. The Office will continue to treat Tribes with the respect and candor that all sovereigns deserve. Rest assured, that relationship will continue.
