

2022 FEDERAL LAW INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians, Office of the Attorney General, operates a summer internship program for up to two (2) law students who have completed at least one year of law school in an ABA accredited institution and who will have completed coursework in federal Indian law by the start of the internship. This internship will be an eight-week period over your college's summer break.

This internship will offer the opportunity to obtain practical knowledge and real-world experience regarding both tribal and federal Indian law. The selected law students will assist the Attorney General with research and drafting of memoranda on a wide-variety of legal matters handled by the office. This position is full-time, working on-reservation at least three (3) days per week. Compensation includes a stipend – either paid directly to you as income, or to your school as a scholarship for tuition – equivalent to \$1,200 per week worked during the internship.

The position will be filled as soon as possible. To apply, please submit the following to Laurel McKee by email at lmckee@rincon-nsn.gov by no later than Friday, October 15, 2021.

- 1) A cover letter;
- 2) A current resume;
- 3) A brief writing sample; and
- 4) A copy of your transcript.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for selection and participation, applicants must meet the following requirements at the time the internship begins and for the duration of the internship:

- 1) Must be currently enrolled at an ABA accredited law school and submit an official law school transcript showing course completion in federal Indian law.
- 2) Must not currently be subject to any disciplinary action by any institution or entity, including, but not limited to, any education or law enforcement agency.
- 3) Must possess a high level of maturity, the ability to work independently, and understand and maintain confidential information.

- 4) Must possess a valid state driver's license, a car and automobile insurance.
- 5) Must sign a services contract and confidentiality, non-disclosure agreement.
